



## Seminar: Creating and Maintaining an Effective Safety Culture

5<sup>th</sup> December 2019,

This seminar will consider how to create and maintain a strong and effective safety culture which is appropriate and relevant to an organisation's needs.

Safety culture is embodied in the attitudes, actions and behaviours of staff and has to be "owned" by the organisation. It is recognised that different industries may require different approaches depending on the safety risks they face, the regulatory environment and the staff they employ.

Of particular importance is to how to ensure resilience: there will always be knock-backs (e.g. due to organisational change and incidents or accidents) and the organisation must be able to recover its safety culture quickly. Also important is how to ensure the culture doesn't degrade, i.e. how to manage the indifference, complacency and poor attitudes and behaviours that can build up over time.

This seminar features seven talks from experts covering different sectors that operate effective safety cultures.

There will be a panel session where the audience to allow further interaction between the delegates and speakers.
